

Data Protection Notice
LUX Audience Award – Subscription to mass mailing

The European Parliament processes your personal data in the context of the organisation of the LUX Audience Award and related activities.

We process your personal data based on Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and Decision No 1247/2002/EC (hereinafter 'the Regulation').

We provide you with the information that follows based on Article 15 of the Regulation.

1. Who processes your personal data (data controller)?

The European Parliament acts as the data controller and the entity responsible for the processing of your personal data is the Civil Society Outreach Unit (CSOU), of the Directorate-General of Communications of the European Parliament, represented by its head of Unit.

2. What is the purpose of the processing of your personal data?

We process your personal data to stay in touch with you and send you information about events and activities related to the LUX Audience Award.

3. What is the legal basis for the processing?

To stay in touch with you and send you information about events and activities related to the LUX Audience Award; the lawfulness of our processing is based on Article 5 (1)(d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, i.e. your consent.

4. What personal data do we process?

The personal data that we process is your email address.

5. Who are the recipients of your data?

In a need to know basis, the staff of DG COMM's Webmasters Unit, in charge of managing the technical aspects of the tool, can access your data.

6. How long will your personal data be stored?

The European Parliament retains your personal data for no longer than is necessary for the purposes for which it was collected.

Your personal data is stored in DGCOMM secured database, CoManSys, until you withdraw your consent. You can do so by clicking the 'Unsubscribe' button available in all of our communications or by contacting the data controller by sending an email with your request to luxaward@europarl.europa.eu.

Every 5 years, we will send you an email to remind you that you still are in our database.

7. Will your personal data be shared with a non-EU country or international organisation?

No, your personal data will not be shared with a non-EU country or international organisation.

8. Are any automated processes and/or profiling used to make decisions which could affect you?

9. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have the rights:

- to access to your personal data
- to rectify your personal data if it is inaccurate or incomplete
- to erase your personal data
- to restrict the processing of your personal data
- to data portability
- to object to the processing of your personal data lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a)

You might withdraw your consent without affecting the lawfulness of processing

based on consent before its withdrawal.
